



### Message from the Mayor

Hi everyone,

As we move through autumn, we're getting ready for the launch of our food and garden organics (FOGO) waste collection service. This new service is in line with Victorian Government legislation, which requires all councils to provide households with a four-stream waste service (glass, recycling, FOGO and rubbish) and is designed to improve recycling and reduce waste.

The rollout of bins has already begun, and by the end of June all properties that are serviced by Yarra will have their bins ready for the collection service to commence from 1 July.

I'm really excited about the difference the FOGO service will make in our community. It reflects our shared values and commitment to a sustainable future and a Circular Economy. Let's embrace this initiative together, as we continue our journey towards a more sustainable Yarra.

Turning to our roads and pathways, I'm thrilled to share our first Transport Action Plan has been approved! We've heard from our community and their desire for Council to take strong action on improving sustainable transport options, with the 10-year Plan outlining actions to deliver the ambitious targets in Yarra's Transport Strategy to help create safer streets and fair access for everyone to move around. We're committed to reducing transport emissions, supporting active lifestyles, and aiming for net-zero emissions by 2030; with the Plan playing an important role in how we will achieve this.

Additionally, we've made strides in sports and recreation at the Yambla Pavilion, introducing three gender-neutral changerooms. This upgrade underscores our dedication to inclusivity and accessibility in community sports, ensuring everyone can participate and enjoy the benefits of local activities. These improvements at Yambla are just the beginning, with more enhancements on the way to support our vibrant community.

Together, these initiatives demonstrate our commitment to a sustainable, inclusive, and thriving Yarra. Thank you for joining us on this journey.

### Driving Yarra forward with our Transport Action Plan

Council recently endorsed its first Transport Action Plan, a key element of the Yarra Transport Strategy. This 10-year agenda aims to revolutionise Yarra's transport landscape, making it more sustainable, accessible and safer. Developed with community input, the plan sets ambitious goals to enhance mobility, expand cycling infrastructure, improve pedestrian safety and increase public transport use, aligning with our ambition for net-zero emissions by 2030.

We'll advocate to Spring Street for significant investment in transport corridors and State funding to support these important upgrades as part of our commitment to a sustainable, well-connected Yarra.

### Accessible EV charging and community battery coming to Clifton Hill

We're collaborating with the Yarra Energy Foundation to bring a new neighbourhood battery system and two wheelchairaccessible electric vehicle (EV) charging stations to Clifton Hill. To be installed near Collingwood Leisure Centre, this first-of-its-kind project in Australia connects a neighbourhood battery with EV charging to enhance both renewable energy use and accessibility. The project is supported by a \$750,000 grant from the Victorian Government's Neighbourhood Battery Initiative.



#### Advocating collectively for positive change

In March Mayors across Melbourne met to agree they will advocate collectively on circular economy, affordable housing and transport improvements.

In May Yarra will ask the Municipal Association of Victoria to call on State Government to stop cutting down trees to achieve electric line clearance in Metropolitan Melbourne, in cases where they don't present a fire hazard.

In July Yarra will ask Australian councils to demand climate action resources from the Federal Government, as it pledged at COP28. Yarra also wants national material product standards so products last longer, are repairable, reusable and recyclable. Also significantly, Yarra will ask that the national council body call on the Federal Government to introduce comprehensive antivilification laws, to protect our diverse community from hate speech.

# Food and garden organics (FOGO) bins are on their way to you!

Our new food and garden organic (FOGO) bins have now begun to be delivered to households and organisations across Yarra.

Those who receive a kerbside collection service will receive a new lime green-lidded bin that will collect food and garden organic (FOGO) materials.

Do not worry if you have not received your bin yet, it will come before the end of June 2024.

Please keep in mind that the FOGO collection service does not commence until first week of July 2024. It's best not to use your bin until close to this first collection date.

This material will be collected and turned into valuable materials like compost, reducing emissions from landfill.

This new service is in line with Victorian Government legislation, which requires all councils to provide households with a four-stream waste service (glass, recycling, FOGO and rubbish) and is designed to improve recycling and reduce waste.

FOGO bins will be collected weekly, on the same day as your rubbish bin. Collections in the Abbotsford alternate collections area will continue unchanged, with FOGO bins collected weekly and rubbish bins collected fortnightly.

Before you begin to use your bin in July, familiarise yourself with what can and cannot go in your FOGO bin.

#### What goes in the bin?



#### The following items can go in your FOGO bin:

- ✓ Fruit and vegetable scraps
- ✓ Bread products
- ✓ Meat and seafood ✓ Plants and
- ✓ Loose leaf tea and coffee grounds
- ✓ Leftovers
- ✓ Garden clippings and weeds
- flowers
  - ✓ Leaves and branches





#### The following items cannot go in your FOGO bin:



- compostable or bio-degradable (including bags and bin liners)
- Plastic bags
- **⊘** Tea bags
- Tissues and napkins
- Products labelled Pet faeces, animal remains and litter tray contents
  - Treated wood or wooden chopsticks
  - Any item that goes in your recycling or glass bin

We're proud to be the first council in Victoria to introduce electric vehicle (EV) street sweepers as part of our ongoing efforts to create a sustainable and cleaner future for our community.

- **Quiet operation:** Meets noise regulations for both day and night-time sweeps.

- Innovative technology: First in Victoria with electric, zero-emission street cleaning.

Our street sweepers cover approximately 300km of roads and laneways and are a core component of our extensive street cleansing program.

In late 2020, we heard your ideas for a new park on Otter Street in Collingwood.

Creating new green spaces in urban innercity environments can be difficult, so we're thrilled to have transformed pavement into a new grassy urban oasis. This space will provide locals and visitors with a place to meet up, hang out and relax!

The newly opened park on the corner of Smith and Otter Streets includes different types of seating, trees and lawns, a new public toilet and artwork by Kamilaroi artist Reko Rennie, honouring the area's rich First Nations history and culture.

As a high-density and fast-growing neighbourhood, we're committed to creating more green space in Collingwood.

The opening of Otter Street Pocket Park follows the opening of the expanded Cambridge Street Reserve in December last year – now Collingwood's biggest park.

This project has been proudly delivered in partnership with the Victorian Government.

Our \$11.65M infrastructure investment has improved roads, sports facilities, and community spaces, with projects like footpath enhancements and new public toilets at Barkly Gardens.



The launch of our sector-leading Financial Sustainability Strategy in December demonstrates our dedication to managing resources to provide for our community now and into the future.


Our priority is a smooth transition, providing personalised and targeted support for clients and their families over a 6 to 12-month period.


