Professor John Whitelegg is the Managing Director of Eco-Logica Ltd, a transport consultancy based in Lancaster specialising in sustainable transport, environmental audit and review, life cycle analysis and corporate environmental strategies.

From 1990 until 1993 John was Head of Department of Geography at Lancaster University and Director of the University's Environmental Epidemiology Research Unit. This unit linked traffic levels and illness. He has written eight books and over 50 papers on transport and environment topics.

John is Founding Editor of the journal "World Transport Policy and Practice" and has acted as a consultant to the government of Australia and governments and community groups in Israel, India, Sweden, Denmark, Romania, Slovenia and Poland. John has worked in detail on alternatives to some of Britain's largest road schemes and on large scale infrastructure projects overseas e.g. the Oresund Bridge linking Sweden with Denmark.

Current projects include transport strategies for Surrey County Council and car-free tourism strategies for East Sussex County Council and Harewood Hall (Leeds). More recently he has worked as a consultant for the Social Exclusion Unit in preparing the report: "Making the Connections: transport and social exclusion" and has carried out one of the first residential travel plans in the country for a 40 storey residential tower block on Liverpool's waterfront.

The Victorian Sustainable Transport Interest Group celebrated its first anniversary in August 2006. STIG aims to be a forum for sharing experiences, ideas and initiatives in this evolving field and improve communication between professionals within local government who have an interest in encouraging walking, cycling, public transport and car pooling.
