<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *1 Angled parking along Mary Street has been excluded, as future usage of Alan Bain Reserve for sporting events will not warrant the increase in car parking. Parallel parking will be retained. *2 The dog walkway has been reduced in extent. *3 The central display bed has been excluded, to streamline path layout and circulation movement. *4 Alan Bain Reserve, City of Years to investigate the option of developing women's soccer and junior cricket activities. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *A War Memorial, The War Memorial will remain in its existing location and will be retained, improvements to extended paving, surrounding planting to be redeveloped to integrate with Gardens landscape. *B Pavillion/War Structure, The Pavillion is centrally located to the War Memorial and will be retained within the new proposal. The Pavillion is centrally located to the historic ornamental character of Barkly Gardens. It will also provide an all weather shelter convenient to the pavilion. *C Barkly Avenue, Revised layout to address omission of proposed sports building and provide an effective integration between the Gardens and the circulation paths. Barkly Avenue is to be closed to vehicular access. A central feature with a footpath network and 3.0m wide blumun shaded pathway to link with existing like paths.
