## Officer Summary of key points from online survey comments

The feedback from the online consultation the following range of views. The intention of providing this information is to show the range of different views. It is noted that the majority of comments in favour of keeping the road open is at a similar level to the overall results, and is by far the most popular opinion.

- 1. There are more important things to focus on
