Yarra shines at Sustainability Awards

Yarra and Merri-bek City Council have been named joint finalists for the 2023 Premier's Sustainability Awards for our Unlocking Sustainable Strata program. This initiative makes sure apartment residents are included in sustainable energy transitions, offering guides for sustainable infrastructure in medium to high-density housing. We have also been awarded the Tidy Cities Award in the Education category at Keep Australia Beautiful Victoria's Tidy Towns and Cities Sustainability Awards for the My Smart Garden program. Spanning 11 Melbourne councils, this program offers resources and workshops on sustainable gardening, water conservation, waste reduction. and more.

Top marks for Yarraberg Children's Centre

Yarraberg Children's Centre has surpassed the National Quality Standard (NQS) in all seven quality areas, a benchmark only 22% of long day care services in Victoria achieve. The centre's commitment to children's wellbeing and understanding of community context were particularly highlighted.

We recently published our Annual Report for 2022/23, showcasing our progress against the goals and priorities of our Council Plan 2021–25, informed by the Yarra 2036 Community Vision.

Yarra Zero: Our effort to end homelessness

Homelessness is a big issue that affects many people. We believe everyone has the right to safe and secure housing. That's why we're working hard to make sure everyone in Yarra has a place to live.

We recently launched a new project called Yarra Zero. This project aims to help people who don't have a home or are sleeping on the streets. We're working with Launch Housing, cohealth and many other partners to make this happen.

The Yarra Zero project is about more than just numbers – it's about knowing each person sleeping rough by name, understanding their unique needs, and supporting them towards stable housing.

"Something that fills me with hope about this project is the prospect of getting to know the people sleeping rough on an individual and intrinsic level," said Verity, who is involved in a work and training program run by the social enterprise For Change Co, which gives youth who have experienced homelessness hospitality training and paid employment.

"We need to uplift and help construct strong foundations for people who haven't had the chance to set down roots or have a proper sense of security," Verity added.



The ultimate goal? Achieving Functional Zero homelessness. This is the measurable milestone that, when sustained, means that homelessness in the community can largely be prevented and that any experiences of it are rare, brief and non-recurring.

Collingwood's biggest park is now open

We recently unveiled the new Cambridge Street Reserve, now standing as the suburb's most expansive green space.

The transformation of the park ensures the space serves as a true reflection of local needs and aspirations.

Doubling in size, the park offers plenty of grassy areas for relaxation, extensive seating for social gatherings, more lighting and important bike infrastructure.

One of the park's highlights is the 'Close Knit' artwork by sculptor William Eicholtz, which was inspired by Australian backyards, and clothes on a Hills Hoist. This theme of home life and handcrafts is woven throughout the park, from flying jumper sculptures to knitted concrete garden walls.



This upgrade was made possible through our partnership with the Victorian Government, who contributed \$1.3 million to the project, in addition to the Council's \$731,130.



Composting in the city: A Carlton North resident's green journey

This year, driven by our commitment to reduce food waste, we've seen 217 compost bins and systems find homes through our compost program!

In the heart of Carlton North, apartment dweller James is among Yarra residents leading the way in urban composting.

"When a neighbour introduced compost bins, we jumped on board," James said.

James has found there are benefits beyond waste reduction, too. "Our indoor bin doesn't smell anymore, since all the nonmeat food waste goes into compost. Plus, watching the compost change with the seasons and spotting worms is fascinating," he said. "It feels good knowing our waste is managed right here, not shipped off somewhere."

For those in apartments, James advises to "use a medium-sized bucket with a lid for food waste. Place it where it's easily accessible during cooking."



Residents can purchase discounted compost systems and even sign up for a free Food Waste Challenge. With initiatives like these and residents like James, Yarra is truly embracing a sustainable future.



Night-time cat curfew begins in January

From Monday 1 January 2024, a night-time cat curfew will be introduced across Yarra. The curfew requires our feline friends to stay within their homes from 7pm to 7am. This initiative, part of our commitment to responsible pet ownership and wildlife protection, aligns with measures taken by other inner-city councils.

Why the curfew?

- **Safety:** Reduces risks of disease, injury, and cats going astray.
- **Wildlife:** Protects our native birds and marsupials from predatory threats.
- Community: Reduces nocturnal cat-related disturbances.

This Christmas, there's a change to waste and recycling collections. As Christmas Day falls on a Monday, there will be no collection on 25 December. All collections for that week will be one day behind, with Friday's pick-up moved to Saturday.

The Recycling Centre will be closed on 24, 25, 26 and 31 December, and 1 January 2024.

Advocacy in Yarra

We champion strategic priorities to State and Federal governments on issues like climate change, active transport, planning, health and wellbeing.

Our advocacy to government helps to amplify the voices in our community on the issues that matter to them. It also brings tangible results like the Learning Bank on Victoria Street in Richmond, backed by the Victorian Government with over \$1.1m, demonstrating our coordinated efforts.

In Collingwood, our advocacy helped to secure over \$2.4m for two new parks, Otter Street Pocket Park and the extended Cambridge Street Reserve. We're also pushing for support for projects like the Charlotte Street Pocket Park, Richmond Youth Hub, pop-up bike lanes, and more accessible tram stops.

Beat the heat: Stay safe and prepared this summer

Extreme heat claims more lives in Australia than any other natural disaster, making readiness key. While anyone can be affected, older people, young children, individuals with medical conditions, and outdoor workers are at higher risk.

Emergency alerts

Connect with local resources, stay updated with weather forecasts, and adjust your schedules to avoid extreme temperatures.

- Download the Vic Emergency App and tune into ABC Melbourne 774 Radio for essential updates.
- Call the VicEmergency Hotline on 1800 226 226 for preparation and planning information.
- Those who are deaf, hard of hearing, or have a speech/communication impairment can reach the hotline via the National Relay Service on 1800 555 677.

Offering help to neighbours, especially older or ill people, strengthens community ties.

Thunderstorm Asthma

Thunderstorm asthma can occur in summer during certain thunderstorms amidst high grass pollen levels, causing wheezing, breathlessness, and coughing. It can be severe and life-threatening. Manage risks by consulting with your doctor, especially if you have asthma or hay fever, and have reliever medication at hand. During grass pollen season, avoid thunderstorm wind gusts by staying indoors.

Branching out: planting trees for climate resilience

Through our Urban Forest Strategy, we're increasing our tree canopy and cooling our streets to respond to the climate emergency.

Yarra's urban tree canopy is now at 17.7% – well on track to meet our goal of 21.25% by 2040.

A key benefit? In inner-city areas like Yarra, hard surfaces like pavements retain heat, creating what's known as the urban heat island effect. Trees help counter this by offering shade and cooling, supporting our resilience against climate change impacts.

Since adopting our Urban Forest Strategy in 2017 we have added:

- 4,000 street trees
- 3.8% to the overall canopy
- 6% to street canopies where heat is most felt



This growth in our urban forest is creating a greener, more resilient Yarra for current and future generations and is an excellent example of how nature can provide climate solutions.
