3. Council's Community Skills for Climate Action program – what it is, who it's for, how you can be involved, how you can help promote this initiative (Michael Oke)

4. Upping the ante on restoration of the Yarra River Riparian Corridor, and how this can be coordinated and delivered. Yarra Rehabilitators – what is, potential for this to be a subcommittee of YEAC? (Chris Currie / Craig Lupton)

Broad conversation on how to support improved outcomes for the Yarra River Riparian Corridor, how best to engage Yarra citizens, and the potential role of a YEAC Subcommittee.

Agreed that YEAC was not the right mechanism to act as a vehicle for an on-ground action group. YEAC is designed for engaged and selected citizens to advise Council on the actions that we should be taking to improve environmental sustainability.

It was agreed that a Terms of Reference (TOR) is needed to define the project scope, duties and tasks, a land tenure map to identify community-based revegetation opportunities on land adjacent to the Yarra River from Dights Falls to Burnley Harbour. Over the preceding 6 months, with support from land managers, opportunities would be identified that would form the basis of available grant options.

Collingwood Children's Farm offers a unique opportunity in Yarra to deliver large scale riparian ecological vegetation class (EVC) reinstatement projects and partner with the Narrap Team and the community to connect and heal country

ACTION: Chris and Craig to develop a TOR, a land tenure map and explore collaborative grant opportunities to deliver community-based reinstatement projects across boundaries. Update YEAC on progress as appropriate.

5. Update on Council Plan/ Future vision process, Council Budget process, and deliberative engagement with the community - what is Yarra doing in this space? The role YEAC members can play if you choose to. (Michael Oke)

The Planning is well underway to develop a new 15 Year Vision for the Municipality and Council Plan for the next four years to progress towards this vision. These are VERY important documents.
