3. Consultation on Roadmap to Zero Emissions in Yarra by 2030 (Hannah Snape (Ironbark Sustainability), Kelly Heffer (Yarra) (6:10-7:10)

Kelly provided the background to the project – where it has come from and what it I trying to achieve:

- Council has engaged local consultants *Ironbark Sustainability* to develop a *'roadmap to zero'* report, to inform Council of the actions needed to drive significant carbon emissions reductions towards meeting a zero net emissions target for the whole municipality by 2030.
- This piece of work has stemmed from the Climate Emergency Plan (pp. 30): In the lead up to expiration of this plan, Council will develop an evidence-based 'roadmap to zero', analysing the emissions reductions potential and cost effectiveness of possible actions.
- This project is intended as guide for the organisation, to show what is technically possible within the Yarra context, and what are key activities that Yarra should focus on or other key stakeholders can influence. The *Roadmap* is not designed to become an endorsed Council plan or strategy, but will be a key report to inform action now and provide further clarity on the way forward to drive reductions in community emissions from the 22/23 financial year onwards.

Kelly Heffer and Hannah Snape stepped through the process and outcomes to date, and highlight some of the key actions that look likely to be part of recommendations in the Roadmap.

Feedback was sought into the process and actions:

- Green Apartments 'seen as new an innovative'. This is an opportunity for Yarra to be a leader.
 50% of Yarra residents. Its really hard but its so important. Also to be able to look at what Yarra is doing and say 'that is me'.
- Overall what does this mean? Is there some indication to their relative contribution and cost
 effectiveness etc. How will council decide which ones to focus on? Still being worked on. The final
 report we will have some review of cost effectiveness / most impactful.
- Composition of the pie in 2030: What does the pie look like then? What are the resistant ections then? Is that where the advocacy should lie?
- How does it seem that this will integrate into CEP? Response: This work helps to prioritise and go into detail for actions that are in the CEP as well a additional ones.
- What is the feeling around sticks as well as carrots eg. Taxing inefficient buildings? Better designed buildings pay less. Commercial/industrial.
- **Vehicle emissions** have we considered car share?
- Resourcing and feasibility it is possible to have joint initiatives
- Council Plan four-year plan how will this process into that?
- Measurement Best measurement for tracking progress is at the programmatic level
- Circular economy and economy and embodied emissions This does not look to be in the Roadmap. Has this been mapped?
- Advocacy getting people off gas seems a massive opportunity. Is this something that the State Government is likely to support?

ACTION: All to send any additional feedback you have to Moke
