2. Lending Library of Things	 Yarra Libraries are piloting a Library of Things program with two portable induction cooktops being made available to lend from June 2023. A brief presentation was given (slides attached). The committee provided ideas and feedback about potential future phases of the program. Officers noted that a trolley to move large objects is among one of the most-sought-after items requested in community Facebook groups, after cardboard boxes. 	30 mins	CG/All
	 Cloth nappies were also identified as an item that could be added to the lending library. Committee members felt there were three emergent themes surrounding the nature of items being suggested: 'moment in your life' objects that are needed for specific life events (e.g. moving house, nursing a baby) 'seasonal' objects that are only needed on special occasions (e.g. Book Week costumes, cake tins) 'try before you buy' objects that people might want to experiment with before deciding if they wanted to purchase their own (e.g. musical instruments, induction cooktops) Committee members expressed a preference for objects to be made available across all Yarra Libraries' branches, with the view that requiring a car to travel to a specific branch to collect an

Project Overview & Engagement Plan May 2023

What is a Library of Things?



A "library of things" is a borrowing service that allows people to check out a wide range of items that they may only need for a short period of time, but that they don't want to buy or can't afford to buy.

Unlike a traditional library, a library of things lends out items such as tools, kitchen appliances, sporting equipment, musical instruments, board games, toys, and even clothing. The idea behind a library of things is to reduce waste, save money, and provide access to resources that might be otherwise inaccessible to some people.

Library of Things - pilot



Yarra Libraries are piloting a "Library of Things" program with two new induction cooktops, which will be integrated with an existing collection of energy efficiency kits.

- A Power-Mate[™] Lite Energy Monitor
- An Energy Saving Thermometer to check whether the temperature of your rooms, fridge and freezer are set to the most energy efficient ranges
- A Non-contact Thermometer measuring the temperature of an object or surface using an infrared sensor
- A Water Flow Measuring Cup to calculate flow rate and help save water

Provide a service that enables community members to borrow objects they would only use occasionally, and might otherwise have purchased and/or provide an outlet for community members to donate objects that take up space in their home and are no longer needed.

Pilot - Test community interest in a broader program of lending objects.

Limits/Parameters

Objects must be of reasonable scale and weight in order to be transported safely Objects must be in good working order

Negotiables

Loan amounts - how long/how many Where the items are kept

Non-negotiables

What items are included in the pilot (2x induction cooktops) Subject to demand - there may be funding available to purchase more
