7. Public question time

7.1 Mr Graham Aldridge - re Petition on 375 Bridge Road Development

Question:

In relation to the petition tabled at the council meeting last week with almost 600 signatories objecting to inappropriate developments like the one proposed at 375 Bridge Road. What is the City of Yarra Council going to do to prevent this 10 storey monstrosity from being built when it should not exceed 5 storeys according to current guidelines?

375 Bridge Road is located in a low rise streetscape section between Griffiths & Coppins Streets. Both sides of Bridge Road at this location fall within the Richmond Town Hall Precinct Heritage Overlay with many 2 storey Heritage listed properties.

With the Developer trying to establish a precedent for high risers in this sensitive low rise Precinct Heritage Overlay can you Madam Mayor call upon the Director of Planning and Place Making to apply heritage principles to prevent this inappropriate development?

Response:

The Mayor advised that in relation to individual planning applications once they are lodged they have to be assessed against the current planning scheme, Councillors do not do the assessment, officers make an assessment, but once it comes to Councillors for a final decision Councillors may make a different assessment. The current planning scheme has a guideline of 5 to 6 storeys maximum across the city. In some areas the Design Development Overlay specify different heights, but in Bridge Road the guideline is 5 to 6 storeys, but discretionary.

The Director Planning and Place Making advised that there is no height control in Bridge Road, and there is no Design Development Overlay, there is heritage overlay and planners will need to assess the matter in relation to all aspects of the planning scheme clauses including the heritage overlay. The interface with abutting properties and streetscape aspects will also be considered. The municipal strategic statement of the planning scheme refers to a strategic intent of 5 to 6 storeys generally, but that is not a control that is a guideline and the matter must be considered on its merits with all those aspects and that will occur. Planners will complete a report and that will be presented at the Internal Development Committee (IDAC).

The Mayor also advised in relation to heritage, the heritage streetscape of the eastern part of Bridge Road is important, however I cannot direct the Director Planning and Place Making to do anything, but is aware that his officers are required to observe the heritage clause 22.05 in assessing the planning application. When the report is presented to Councillors and they also look at it, they may make a slightly different decision or they may make the same one.

7.2 Ms Teresa Konopacki - Development at 130 Gibbs Street Abbotsford (PLN16/0236) Question:

Does the Planning Department run on commission?

I received an email yesterday in response to my objection, there was an amendment and I did object to the amendment.

I live in Abbotsford and fell in love with the neighbourhood character, I was raised in York Street and consider myself a local.

Since objecting I have had the run-around from the counter, from officers that will not answer any of my questions or not direct me to specifics so that I could object.

What price is my sunlight? I am about to have an almost 3 meter brick wall, 80 centimetres from all my windows which are west facing. How is this possible?

I am now facing VCAT.

Response:

The Mayor advised the resident that the planning department does not receive a commission. The planning application has been approved under delegation by the planner and it is my understanding that your situation hasn't been taken into account. The planners have suggested that you can take your matter to VCAT. I will be happy to help you with the VCAT process and to meet with you tomorrow as well as the other Ward Councillors. Given a decision has been made and there is a process underway that is what we can do.

9. Delegates' reports

9.1 Councillor Fristacky - Bargoonga Nganjin North Fitzroy Library

Councillor Fristacky reported the following:

As Ward Councillor, I wish to put on the record the extensive and effusive community appreciation passed onto Yarra Council for the outcome on Saturday 8 April 2017 for the opening the Bargoonya Nganjin North Fitzroy Library & Community Hub, located on a unique triangular site at 182 St Georges Road, North Fitzroy. This was a memorable occasion with fine speeches by the Mayor, CEO and local member, Richard Wynne MP.

The history of the library dates back to 1970's when after community representations, a North Fitzroy Library was established in rented premises on St Georges Road near Holden Street.

The community however, continued to advocate for a permanent home for their library in lieu of a small rented shopfront.

- A working party on the Inner Circle Railway Linear Park Reserve resulted in the 1987 Pullen Report recommending that the heritage Fire Station on St Georges Road on the edge of Linear Park be offered to Council for the North Fitzroy library.
- \$100,000 was set aside by the Yarra Commissioners in 1994 for purchase of a library site; it was insufficient to buy the Fire Station which was sold in 1994 by the State for private residential development.
- After restoration of elected Councillors in 1995, the North Fitzroy Library in 1997 after 20 years near Holden Street, moved to more central rented premises on St Georges Road, south of Michael Street. It operated there for the next 20 years until April 2017.
- The Library Friends in the 1990's continued to press for a permanent home. I was their representative in a Regional Library Community Advisory Committee which advocated to Council and the then Yarra-Melbourne Regional Library Board (dissolved 2006) for permanent premises.
- In 2003, a North Fitzroy Library Steering Committee was created following a Council resolution to find a permanent home for the library and to examine the triangular site at 186 St Georges Road. This site was the subject of a 24 hour car wash application, refused in 2003 by Council and Council's refusal upheld at VCAT. The community were instrumental in the successful submissions at VCAT.
- Report by Consultant John Liddle in 2003, recommended that Yarra consolidate its libraries and close 2 of its 5 libraries including North Fitzroy. This was despite data that showed North Fitzroy library to be one of Yarra's best performing libraries in terms of loans and visitations, despite its cramped space in a small rented shop front.
- With ongoing strong advocacy, Council examined a range of sites on St Georges Road but was unable to purchase a suitable site in a rising property market.
- Council finally resolved in 2009 to pursue acquisition of the triangular site at 182-186 St Georges Road to house the North Fitzroy Library Hub with this process not resolved until 2011.

- A Community Design Reference Group advised Council on design issues for the library hub.
- The lengthy design process recognising the aspirations and vision of the community has produced an outstanding building.

The result is an ecstatic community, thrilled that after multiple resolutions through Fitzroy and Yarra Councils and multiple sites examined for over 30 years, they have a dazzling building in a perfect location in the heart of North Fitzroy Village, which will serve the community for centuries to come.

The North Fitzroy Library is a huge credit to the community and Council responding to the community with long standing and stalwart advocates; - **Anne Horrigan Dixon, Marilyn Dawson and Gabrielle Murphy.** It is particularly thrilling for me having represented the Friends of the Library from the 1990s for improved library services as a community representative and as a Councillor since March 2002, advocating for the triangular site as the perfect location in the heart of the Village for a community facility.

Near 4,000 people went through the Hub at its opening on Saturday, when visitation to the Library would normally be around 400. Visitors included former Yarra Councillors, the Mayor of Bayside and officers from several other Councils. Excited parents and kids particularly relished in the magnificent building and facilities.
