## **TERMS OF REFERENCE**



Туре	Advisory Committee
Purpose	The Rainbow Advisory Committee provides information, support and advice, and a mechanism for communication and consultation between LGBTIQA+ communities and Council, on issues affecting the LGBTIQA+ community.
Objectives	<ul> <li>The Committee:</li> <li>advises on the implementation of the Yarra LGBTIQA+ Strategy 2021-2024<sup>1</sup> and subsequent action plans and strategies</li> <li>provides feedback to Council on policies, plans and services that impact the LGBTIQA+ community</li> <li>provides information and strategic advice to Council on matters affecting the needs, interests and well-being of the LGBTIQA+ community</li> <li>advises Council on its communication, engagement and consultation with the LGBTIQA+ community, and facilitates communication and consultation processes with the LGBTIQA+ community</li> <li>acts as a conduit for the exchange of information and views between community, Council and other representative bodies on issues affecting the LGBTIQA+ community</li> </ul>
Membership	<ul> <li>The Committee is to be made up of two Councillors and a further fourteen community members, including</li> <li>up to ten members of the Yarra community</li> <li>a minimum of two representatives from community organisations that support Yarra's LGBTIQA+ community</li> <li>a minimum of two representatives from Yarra's LGBTIQA+ business community</li> </ul>
Chair	The role of meeting chair shall alternate between appointed Councillors.

Selection Criteria	Members are selected on the basis of their:
	<ul> <li>identification as LGBTIQA+</li> <li>capacity to consult with the LGBTIQA+ community and represent a wide range of views</li> <li>understanding of the needs of the LGBTIQA+ community;</li> <li>capacity to analyse information and provide advice on issues affecting the LGBTIQA+ community</li> <li>As far as practicable, the composition of the community members will reflect the diversity of the LGBTIQA+ community including:</li> <li>Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people</li> <li>people from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) backgrounds</li> <li>people from variety of life stages</li> <li>people from different locations across the municipality</li> </ul>
	Community representatives can be people who live, work, study or have another connection to Yarra.
	The term of appointment for community members will be four years. Each two years, half of the group will retire. Retiring members will be eligible for reappointment.
Meeting arrangements	Meetings are held six times per year.
