

Currently, there is a small waiting list Planning is underway for Elder Abuse Awareness Day in Jue and the Seniors Festival throughout October.  ACTION: Provide feedback to the Climate Emergency Team noting that the Climate Safe Room project is fantastic and showing fast results.

5. Discussion on reinvesting in aged services in accordance with the Council resolution from March 12, 2024

# Overview by Manager of Aged & Disability Services:

- Committee sought an update on the status of re-investment in ageing well.
- The Manager provided an overview to set the scene for the discussion.
- Yarra has finalised the exit from home care services as of 30 April 2025.
- Community transport, meals, home maintenance, and social support groups will continue, with the next Federal Govt Service and Funding Agreement due to run for two years - (2025-2027).
- Reform is on-going and will need to monitor key directions across next several years.

### Council Meeting on 12.03.24:

- Two Committee members presented on the reinvestment in aged services.
- The Committee discussed the processes for how Council will prioritise and use the funds now that it is no longer providing subsidies in that area.

#### **Current Context:**

- This discussion is well-timed as Council is currently finalising the draft Community
   Vision, Council Plan 2025-29, and budget.
- These documents will be ready for public comment from 24 April 2025.

It was agreed to have an additional meeting early next month for the Committee to brainstorm ideas on priorities. There was clarity sought about what money was available to spend for 're-investment' and Officers took this on notice.

Current ideas canvassed at the meeting include:

- Prevention initiatives maintaining the wellbeing of older people in the community to delay moving into higher needs categories.
- Actions for community members with high needs.
- Community connector roles (regarding single aged care assessment referrals).
- Improving communications to act as a conduit between orgs providing services and ageing well initiatives.

		The Committee agreed to review the upcoming budget.  ACTION: Request an aged services breakdown of the budget for AAAC tracking.  ACTION: Submit a budget bid from the AAAC (if Committee deems this is required).  ACTION: Schedule a 1-hour special AAAC meeting on MS Teams to discuss ageing well priorities.

The Committee discussed that this seems inadequate for the content covered at the AAAC and have asked if the AAAC could have the option for more frequent meetings or the ability to adopt a flexible schedule.</li> <li>When the Expressions of Interest for the AAAC opens current members are welcome to reapply.</li> <li>The Committee were asked if they were comfortable for their names to be added to website. In the past we have not included members names on the website or minutes.
