

CURTAIN WARD UPDATE

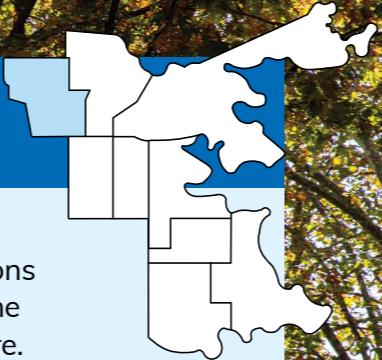
Carlton North, Princes Hill and part of Fitzroy North

Working for You: Local projects in your area

An overhaul of Park Street, Carlton North

We've made some changes to the road and footpath on Park Street in Carlton North including a new raised pedestrian crossing; removal of an existing road hump (west of Drummond Street); the reconstruction of a raised pedestrian crossing on Park Street (east of Drummond Street); improved intersection drainage and rearranged street parking bays; line marking, road pavement and footpath reinstatement works; new kerb extensions with landscaping and new bike hoops.

These improvements were funded by the Victorian Government as part of its Safe System Pedestrian Infrastructure Program.

Princes Hill Kindergarten upgrades

Council has finished a series of works to freshen up Princes Hill Kindergarten. They included installing new signage, lighting and ceiling fans. New acoustic panels have also been placed on the walls and ceiling to reduce noise levels, with the aim to make the kindergarten a more supportive place for children to learn and grow.

Making Lygon Street safer

Following advocacy by the local community, Council, and Cr Crossland, the State Government will be changing the speed limit of Lygon St to 40km per hour, making it safer for everyone.

Linear Parklands (\$150,000)

Progress the design work of Linear Parklands Masterplan.



Stormwater renewals on Amess Street (\$1.04m)

A rebuild and renewal of the footpaths, kerbs, channels, road, and stormwater treatment for a large part of the street. This will protect the street from flooding.



North Carlton Railway Neighbourhood House improvements

North Carlton Railway Neighbourhood House is set for a \$35,000 upgrade, including a new dishwasher and outdoor shade sail, to make community activities more comfortable and convenient.



Relining brick drains on Newry Street (\$200,000)

Improving drainage on this key road between Henry Street and Canning Street.

Improving your streets



Pedestrian crossings in Princes Hill (\$422,000)

Construct raised pedestrian (wombat) crossings at Garton and Richardson Streets and Garton and Patterson Streets to improve safety around Princes Hill Secondary College and to access Princes Park.



A safer O'Grady Street (\$120,000)

Construct kerb outstands on O'Grady Street to improve safety around Carlton North Primary School.
