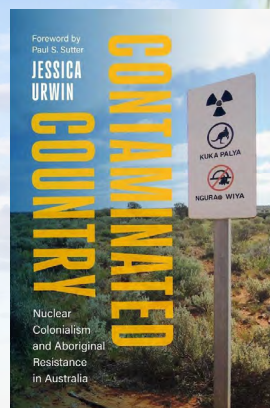


JESSICA URWIN
